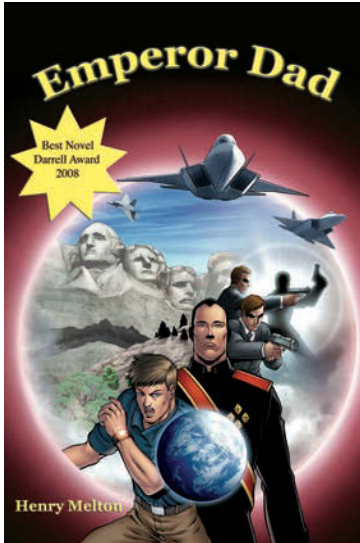


# Emperor Dad
